- Oral health screenings and connection to dental homes
- Nutrition counseling
- Promotion of healthy life style choices
- Family planning consultation
- Navigation assistance in accessing community resources
- Education on preparing for baby, infant care and safety

Firefly's Healthy Pregnancy program provides these services for Iowa Medicaid eligible pregnant people in Cass, Harrison, Ida, Mills, Monona, Pottawattamie, Shelby, and Woodbury counties.
